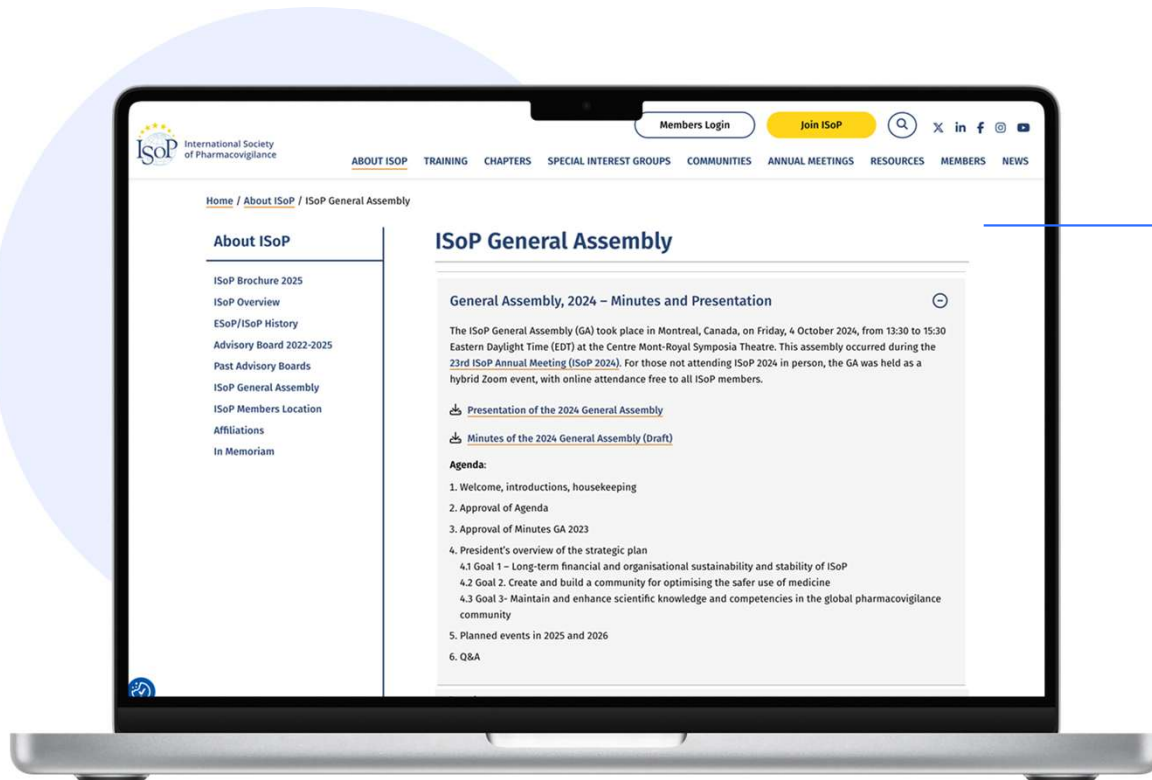

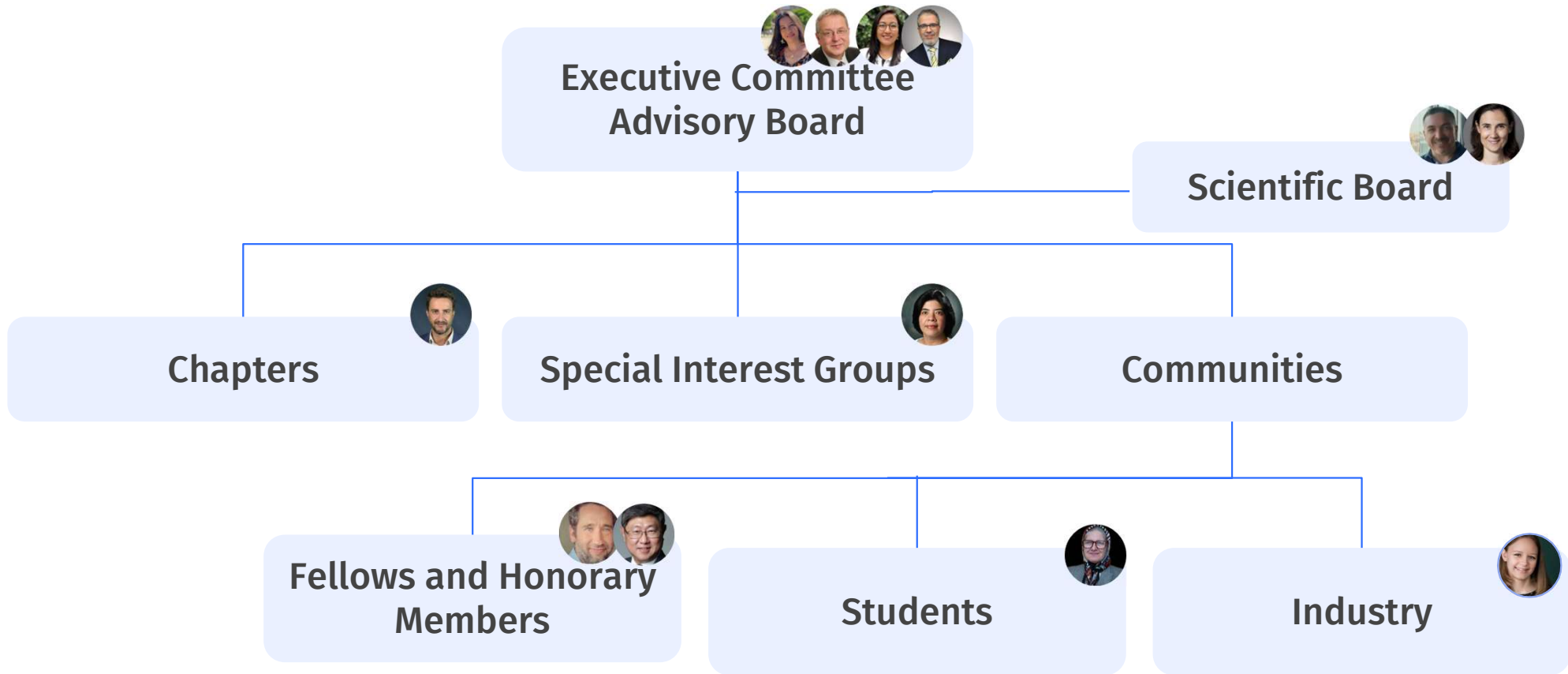

4.1.1. By-laws Update for adoption and ISoP documents

Article 3 - Membership

Section (vii) – **Update** according to the new Chapters guidelines document:

ISoP members in one geographical region may form a chapter to facilitate the organisation of meetings, training courses, or other activities related to the missions of ISoP. Normally at least **fifty** members are needed to constitute a chapter unless agreed with the Executive Committee.

- vii) ISoP members in one country or geographical region may form a chapter to facilitate the organisation of meetings, training courses, or other activities related to the missions of ISoP. Normally at least ten members are needed to constitute a national chapter unless agreed with the Executive Committee.

Article 3 - Membership *Section (viii) – **Update***

A Special Interest Group (SIG) can be initially created by at least five ISoP members to discuss and work on a specific and relevant topic which is within the scope and aims of ISoP.

- viii) A Special Interest Group (SIG) can be created by at least five ISoP members to discuss and work on a specific and relevant item which is within the scope and aims of ISoP. 

Article 3 - Membership

*Section (ix) – **Addition** of a new section describing the Community group:*

A community is a group of ISoP members, approved by the Executive Committee, united by shared interests and needs, working collaboratively to advance pharmacovigilance and further the objectives of ISoP.

Article 4- Membership fee

ii) - **Update** Article

As a compensation for the considerable input of voluntary time expected of elected members of the Advisory Board, their membership fees will be waived during the length of their active service on **the Advisory Board**.

- ii) As a compensation for the considerable input of voluntary time expected of elected members of the EC, their membership fees will be waived during the length of their active service on the EC

Article 5 - Admission to membership and data protection

5.1 – **Updated** Article

New applications for membership will be reviewed by the Secretary and **the Executive Secretary of ISoP Secretariat.**

5.1 New applications for membership will be reviewed by the Secretary or the President before final approval of the application.

Article 11 - Executive Committee **Addition** of a new Article (11.3):

11.3 The Executive Committee has the authority to grant special recognition to outstanding ISoP members who have carried out voluntary work within the organization.

Article 9 - The Advisory Board of ISoP

9.4 – **Updated** section

All members of the Board will have a specific role, as follows.

Four members (President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer) will form the Executive Committee.

- One member will be responsible for coordination of ISoP Chapters.
- One member will be responsible for coordination of ISoP Special Interest Groups.
- The remaining members will be assigned any other responsibility as directed by the Executive Committee. It is recommended to have an Academic coordinator, a Strategy and Innovation leader, a Communication leader, and a Community coordinator.

- Four members will each be responsible for coordinating education and training in each of the four regions of Africa, the Americas, Asia/Pacific and Europe.



Annex 3 – ISO-P Scientific Board (SB) Mission and Objectives

The mission of the SB is to support ISO-P's scientific and educational activities and to offer expert advice on pharmacovigilance worldwide.

The SB will convene and discuss matters brought to its agenda by any of its members, or by ISO-P's Executive Committee (EC) or Advisory Board (AB). Examples of activities include:
Provision of scientific and academic authority to ISO-P advice, supporting any ISO-P projects by offering input, revision, opinion, recommendations, publications, and networking
Special projects see ToR

Appointment of Fellows of the Society

Updated section

i) Within the Advisory Board, a Fellows Nominations Sub-Committee (FNSC) is established, comprised of the ISoP Secretary (chair) and two other members of the EC/Advisory Board or **Fellowship group**. The ISoP Secretary invites other members of the EC/AB or **Fellowship group** to volunteer for these positions by email. If there are more than two members wishing to be on this sub-committee, the Secretary will discuss with the President and their decision will be final.

ii) The FNSC considers applications for ISoP Fellowship submitted to them by members. Assessment is according to the criteria approved **by the Advisory Board**.

ii) The FNSC considers applications for ISoP Fellowship submitted to them by members. Assessment is according to the criteria approved by the General Assembly.

iv) There is an annual timetable for this process, to allow ideally between **six and two months to apply**, from the closing date for submissions, through to announcement of new ISoP Fellows at the General Assembly.

Evolution of ISO P assets in the past 3 years

Strategic Investment: The decline in net assets (2022-2025) is the result of a deliberate **growth strategy**. The funds were invested in **critical areas**: a new administrative role, a new website, communications, and ISO P visibility.

Strategy is Working: The financial data confirms **the plan is effective**. The sharp slowdown in the rate of decline (-7.6% to just -0.26%) shows that the growth in membership is generating **new revenue**, which is now nearly covering the increased costs.

Strengthened Position: While net assets are lower, the organization has built a **stronger foundation with greater capacity**, modernized infrastructure, and a larger membership base, positioning it for a more **sustainable future**.

From Investment to Sustainable Growth



Imminent Break-Even: The trends indicate the organization is on track to reach a new, higher break-even point very soon (potentially in 2026), where growth-related revenue fully funds the expanded operations.



Path to Renewed Growth: Once the new break-even point is achieved, continued membership growth and operational efficiency should lead to a return to net asset growth, building from a much more robust and active platform than in 2022.



Focus on ROI: The next phase should shift to measuring the Return on Investment (ROI) of the specific initiatives (website, admin role, communication and increasing activities and ISoP visibility) to quantify their impact and guide future spending.

In short, the organization successfully used its reserves to fuel growth and is now transitioning from an investment phase to a **sustainable growth phase**.



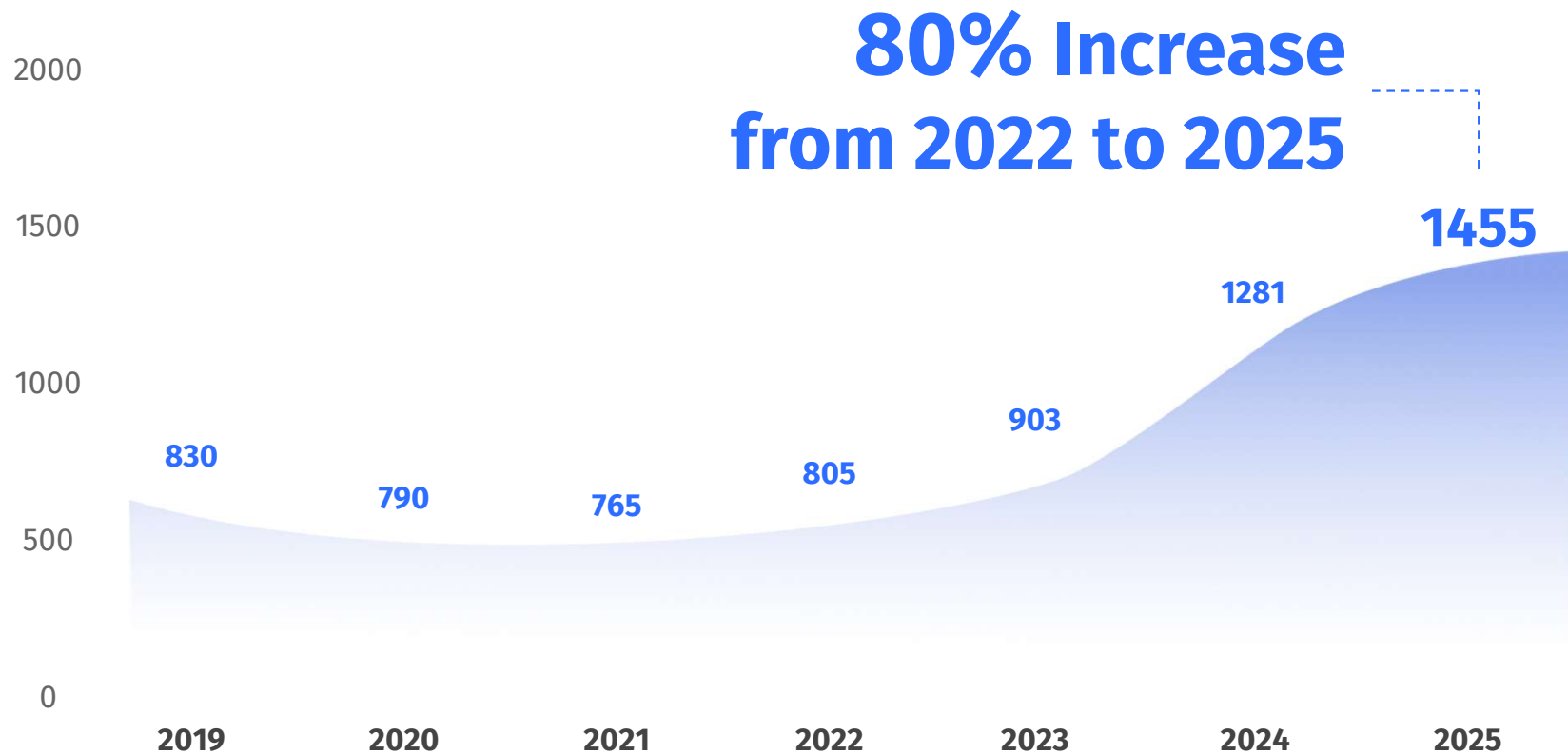

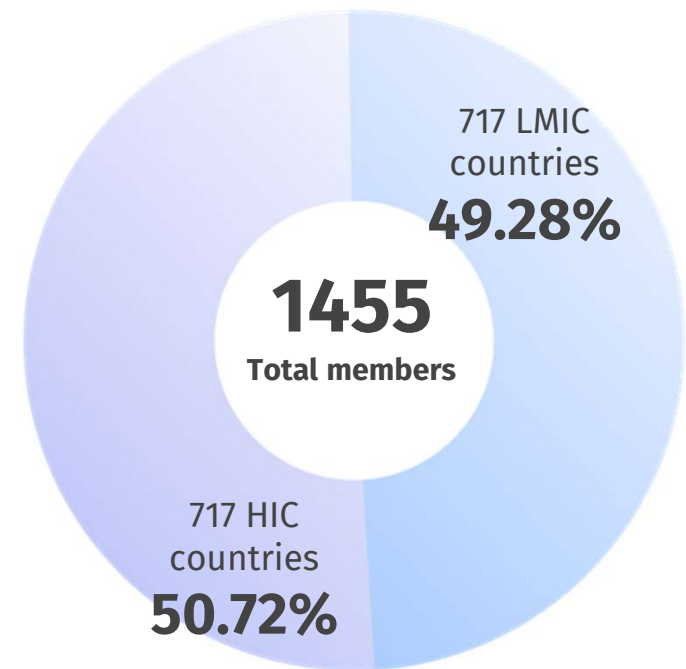
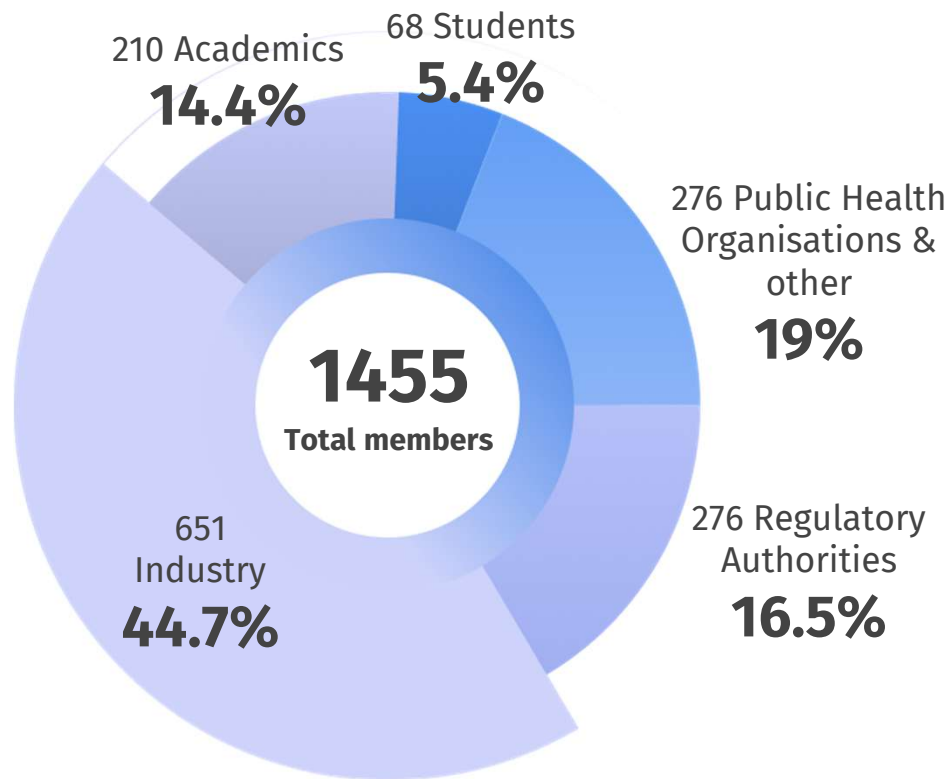

ISoP membership Sept 2024- Sept 2025

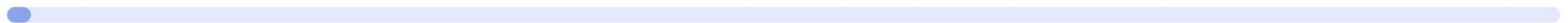

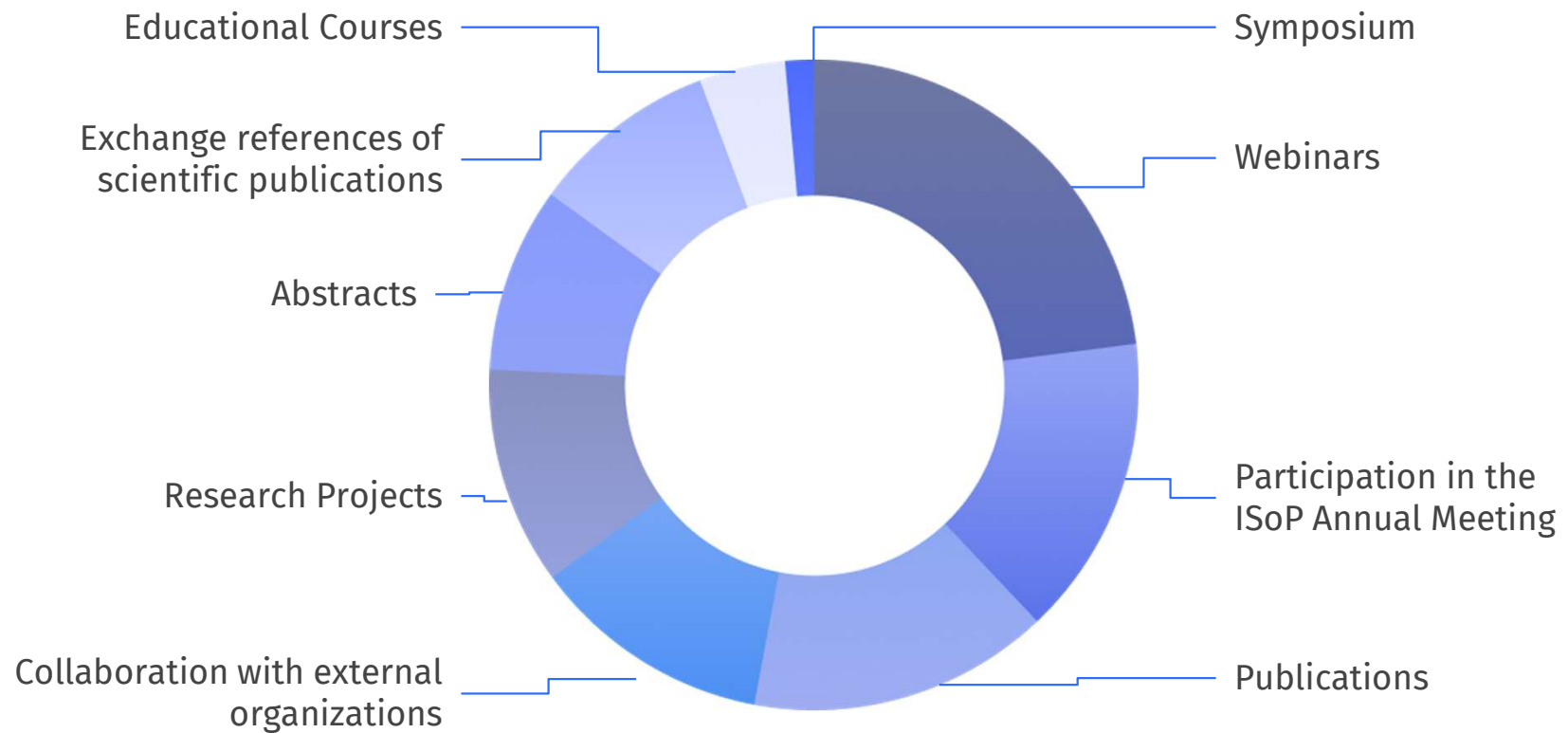
Number of members per SIG (Sep 2024 - Aug 2025)

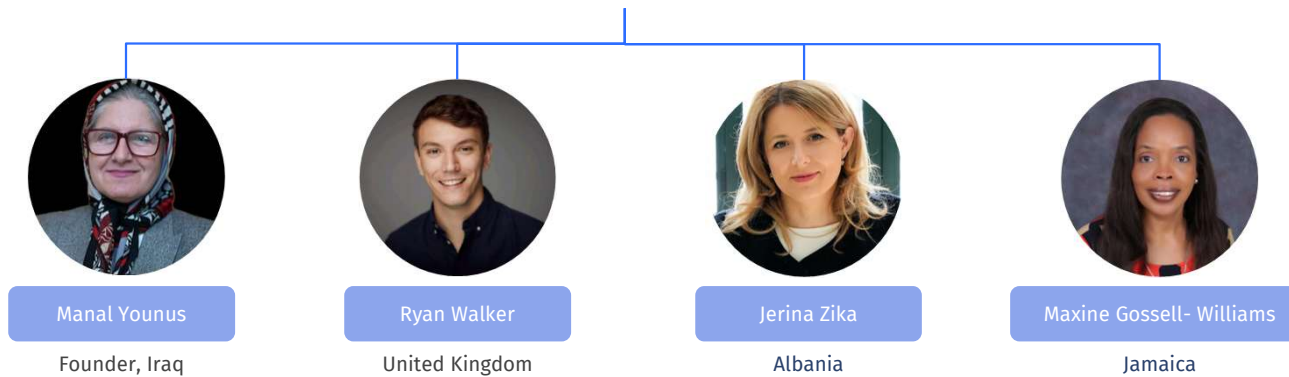

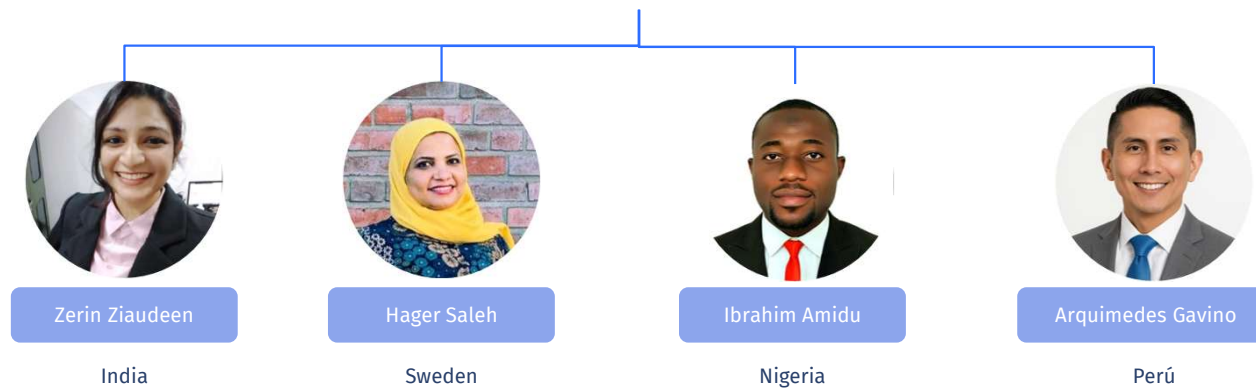

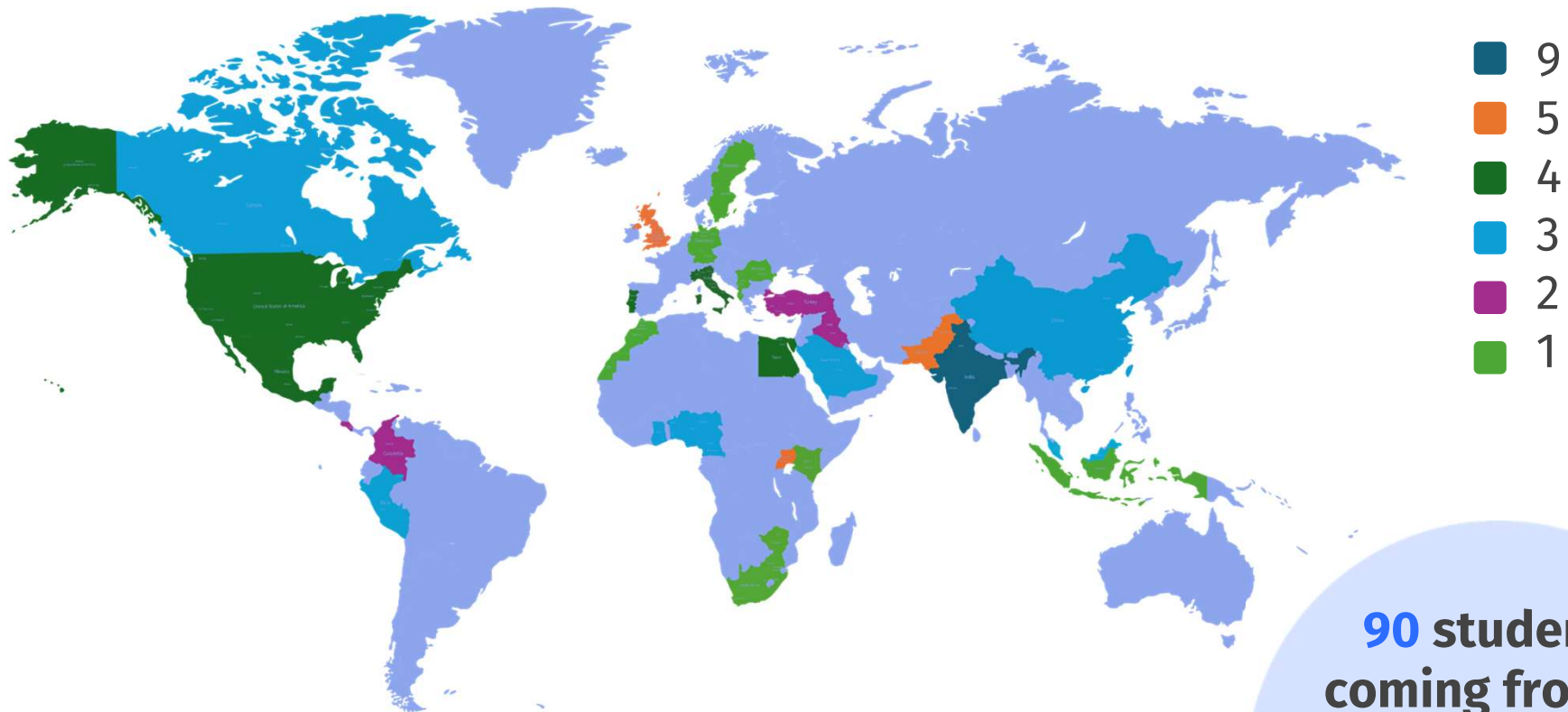
