



Call for Applications: Fellowship of the International Society of Pharmacovigilance (ISoP) 2026

Deadline for Applications: 1 June 2026

Definition of ISoP Fellows

Fellows of the International Society of Pharmacovigilance (the Society) are members who have demonstrated significant achievement and distinction in their field, including peer recognition in pharmacovigilance (PV). They have made substantial contributions to the discipline and have shown consistent service to the Society, such as active involvement in ISoP meetings or leadership roles within Chapters and Special Interest Groups (SIGs).

Selection Volume: Please note that the final number of Fellows elected is at the discretion of the committee and will be based on the total volume and quality of applications received. Selection is competitive and involves a comparative review of the top eligible profiles.

Benefits and Responsibilities

Benefits of Fellowship:

- Use the designation FISO (Fellow of the International Society of Pharmacovigilance) in professional communications, CVs, and public profiles.
- Receive an official certificate of Fellowship during the General Assembly at the ISoP Global Meeting in Costa Rica 2026.
- Have your profile featured in the official ISoP communications and on the ISoP website.
- Gain international exposure and access to exclusive networking and leadership opportunities.

Responsibilities of Fellowship:

- Maintain a high level of engagement with the Society's activities, including participation in SIGs and Chapters.
- Actively contribute to the ISoP Mentorship Programme to support the development of future leaders in the field.

Eligibility Criteria & Global Equity Commitment

ISoP is committed to global equity, recognizing that impactful PV takes many across regions.

1. **Contributions to PV:** Demonstrated through career progression and a sustained record of contributions to the field. (Note on publications: While peer-reviewed international journals are valued, ISoP equally recognises high-quality research published in regional journals, repositories, or the authorship of national technical guidelines and policies that have significantly improved patient safety in your region).
2. **Service to ISoP:** Active involvement in the Executive Committee (EC), Advisory Board (AB), leadership roles within Chapters/SIGs, or contributions to Society meetings (e.g., as a speaker, committee member, session chair, or poster reviewer).
3. **Membership:** A minimum of (5) consecutive years as a full ISoP member, with current membership fees fully paid by the application deadline.
4. **Supporting References:** Two recommendation letters from senior ISoP members (EC and/or AB Members, Honorary Members, or current Fellows).
 - Note: Each senior ISoP member may issue only one recommendation letter per application cycle. Applicants must verify this with their referees before submission.
 - Members of the current Fellows Nominations Sub-Committee (FNSC) cannot provide recommendation letters and cannot apply for FISO.

Application Process

Applicants must submit the following documents as a single PDF file to administration@isoponline.org by 1st June 2026:

- **Completed Application Form:** Signed and dated.
- **Statement of Achievements (max. 2 pages):** A clear narrative outlining your impact. Please include headings: "Contribution to Pharmacovigilance" and "Contribution to ISoP".
- **Two Recommendation Letters (max. 1 page each):** From senior ISoP members. (adhering to the one-letter-per-referee rule)
- **Full CV:** Including a summary of career progression and a comprehensive list of publications and/or technical contributions.

Review and Selection

Applications will be reviewed by the **Fellows Nominations Sub-Committee (FNSC):**

- Dr. Felipe Villalobos (Chair, ISoP Secretary General)
- Dr. Francesco Salvo (ISoP Vice President)
- Dr. Hadir Rostom (ISoP Advisory Board Member)
- Mrs. Sophie Spence (ISoP Executive Secretary)

The FNSC will present the candidates to the EC for final decision. All applicants will be informed of the outcome during June 2026, and newly nominated Fellows will be formally announced at the General Assembly during the ISoP Global Meeting in Costa Rica 2026.
