Drug Safety Journal Requirements for 'From the ISO P' Submissions

From the ISO P-Sponsored Content should be submitted to *Drug Safety* only after peer review and approval by the ISO P Executive Committee; authors must select the article type "Editorial" during submission, which will be updated to "From the ISO P" during production.

Manuscripts should be approximately 4,000 words, include no more than one figure and one table, and contain fewer than 20 references. Electronic Supplementary Material (ESM) may be provided and must include, at the beginning of each file, the article title, journal name, author names, affiliations, and corresponding author email (for Excel files, this information should appear in a separate worksheet); ESM is published as submitted without editing or reformatting, so authors must ensure accuracy, and files should be submitted in PDF format (not .doc or .ppt), with separate reference lists where applicable and cited in the manuscript as "see online resource, figure/table X."

A running header of no more than 100 characters is required.

If an author is a member of the journal's Editorial Board, this must be disclosed under Conflicts of Interest using the specified statement "[Author Name] is an Editorial Board member of [journal name]. [Author Name] was not involved in the selection of peer reviewers for the manuscript nor in any of the subsequent editorial decisions."

References must include DOIs for published works and direct URLs for web sources.

Contributions from individuals, institution or entity who have made a substantial contribution to the article/study/analysis but does not qualify as an author, can be done in a separate 'Acknowledgements' section before the 'Declarations' section. Authors must obtain written permission from all individuals, institutions or entities named in the Acknowledgement section.

A Declarations section must be added with the following mandatory headings:

- a) Funding (information that explains whether and by whom the research was supported)
- b) Conflicts of interest (include appropriate disclosures): please ensure that each author is covered in this section. Competing interests are defined as any interests that could be perceived to be influencing the work reported, and our policy (see <https://www.springer.com/gp/editorial-policies/competing-interests>) explains that "authors are requested to disclose interests that go beyond financial interests that could impart bias on the work submitted for publication such as professional interests, personal relationships or personal beliefs (amongst others). Please confirm you have fully considered this policy.
- c) Ethics approval
- d) Consent to participate
- e) Consent for publication
- f) Availability of data and material (data transparency): The journal encourages data sharing, and statements regarding data availability are required. For more details, please visit <https://www.springernature.com/gp/authors/research-data-policy>. If not

applicable to your article, please add “Data sharing is not applicable to this article as no datasets were generated or analysed during the current study”.

- g) Code availability (software application or custom code)
- h) Authors' contribution: Please clarify the contribution of each author. Please also add the mandatory statement "all authors read and approved the final version".
