Intelligent Automation in Pharmacovigilance

We are delighted to call for oral presentations for the **10th ISoP Seminar 2026**, to be held on December 3-4, 2026, at Pfizer premises in Cambridge (MA), USA.

As this year marks the 10th edition of the ISoP Boston Intelligent Automation in Pharmacovigilance event—a significant milestone—the seminar theme is **“10 Years of PV Intelligence: Shaping the Future of Patient Safety.”**

Day 1 will explore the evolution of artificial intelligence and intelligent automation in pharmacovigilance over the past decade, while Day 2 will focus on the current regulatory landscape, ongoing initiatives, and future directions.

Abstract submission guidelines and formatting instructions

The International Society of Pharmacovigilance (ISoP) would like to invite you to participate in the **10th ISoP Seminar 2026**, to be held on December 3-4, 2026, at Pfizer premises in Cambridge (MA), USA.

We want to offer students and researchers the opportunity to present their research in the form of flash presentations (10 minutes).

Abstracts should be well-aligned with the theme of the symposium **‘10 Years of PV Intelligence: Shaping the Future of Patient Safety’**.

Participants will be notified of their acceptance or rejection of their abstracts. The accepted abstracts will be presented as an oral presentation (10 minutes plus 5 minutes for discussion) during the seminar. **It is not possible to present abstracts as posters at the meeting.**

Accepted abstracts by presenters, who have paid their registration fee, will be published on the ISoP website. Abstracts must be submitted in English only.

Abstract Submission deadline: 1 October 2026

- Abstracts notification: **7 October 2026**
- The registration deadline for presenters: **21 October 2026**

Authors are responsible for confirming that the ISoP Secretariat office received the abstract within the deadline.

Presenters of accepted abstracts are required to register for the conference and must pay the appropriate registration fee by 21 October 2026.

Instructions to Authors

Before proceeding to submit your abstract, please read the attached author instructions to ensure you have all the information needed to complete the submission process. Abstracts that do not conform to the requirements will not be accepted.

Abstract formatting instructions

Title: In bold, title case, maximum twenty words
[New line]



Author(s): First name initial(s) with full point followed by surname. Put each author on the same line but separate each author with a comma.

[New line]

Affiliation(s): Department, institution, city, country.

If there is more than one affiliation for the authors, each one should be separated by a semicolon and preceded by a number (the same number should appear superscript after the comma after the relevant author's name).

[New line]

Text: Maximum 400 words. For studies use a structured approach with bolded subheadings and structure the abstracts as: **“Introduction, Objective, Methods, Results, Conclusion, References/Further sources of information.”**

[New line]

References: Cite in text as [x]. List on separate lines preceded by the relevant number. Use Vancouver style. A maximum of 6 references can be included.

Tables: One table can be included with each abstract and the table must not contain more than 4 columns and 10 rows. Please prepare the table in 'table format', rather than using 'tab' or 'indent' commands.
